#### Greetings,

I am an inmate at Arrowhead Correctional Facility here in Canon City, Colorado. I have been a member of AA for several years and I believe that the program has changed my life forever. I currently chair ALL the meetings at this facility. The problem that I am having is that we have not had a meeting here since November 2011. At one point last year we were having close to 10% of the 500 inmates here attending our weekly meeting. We have lost our volunteers that came in the facility and allowed us to have meetings.

Can you please put the word out to whomever possible, and let them know that we need volunteers? AA is very important to a lot of us inmates, and is all that we have to look forward to, to help us help ourselves become sober, responsible adults, in and out of prison.

# **Changing the Scenery**

A newcomer learns that sobriety is an internal journey

I grew up in a good home. My father was an alcoholic and I swore I would never be like him. I was closer to my mom. My father was never affectionate or loving towards me or my siblings.

I got pregnant at 15 and married. I divorced 6 months later. I got into a relationship 3 years later and had 2 more children. Drinking was not yet a big part of my life. I left that relationship and meanwhile I was still working at a bank. I met my second husband of 10 years who was an alcoholic. I was so intrigued by him.

He took me to places I've never been or seen. He wined and dined me. He was 10 years older than me. At first I was really happy and excited with my life.

His drinking was continuing to get out of control. I would go out with him once in awhile but it was never an issue in my life. I could have 2 or 3 beers and be done with it. He was very controlling over me and I was not allowed to have friends or go out anywhere besides shopping or work without him. It seemed as though I was just living my life to make him happy instead of myself. After 10 years of this, I left him and moved down to Central Florida where my parents have a condominium. I was in heaven! No husband, no kids and all kinds of entertainment right outside my door.

I started to go out every night.

My drinking progressed—I

was no longer drinking beer.

I started drinking cocktails
with vodka. I began to get the
shakes in the morning and a
friend told me about the hair
of the dog. It seemed like the
right thing to do because it
worked. I found myself drinking morning-to-night. It was
not as fun anymore. I ended up
going to detox 8 times within
a 2-year frame. I would get

country in upstate New York where I'm from. We got our apartment 6 miles from my parents house and he got an excellent job. My drinking continued.

I went to detox 4 more times and rehab 3 times. My whole theory for relocating was thrown out the window. I was drinking more than ever.

My life has completely changed and I gain strength, growth and knowledge everyday. My trust in women in the program is unconditional. I feel something strong inside of myself I've never felt before. I moved out and stayed at people's houses where I knew there would be vodka. I was getting physically sicker, and losing all my loved ones.

Something happened and I believe it to be my spiritual awakening. I made a phone call to a special friend telling him how my life was worthless and that I was drinking uncontrollably. That was the true beginning of my sober journey.

I was guided here through the grace of God. I am regaining

I plan to continue my support in the rooms of AA. I am planning on going back to New York and getting a sponsor and taking all of the knowledge I've learned and observed here for the 90 days I've been here with me. If I continue this path I know I will live a life with peace and serenity I've been searching for inside myself.
