Age Will Take Care of Your Ego

When I was young, I was filled with "piss and vinegar" – and ego. It was all about what I wanted, what I thought I deserved, and I didn't think twice about how I got it. As my drinking and drug use got worse, my ego only seemed to grow. Isolated in the prison of self, with only self-seeking and self-centered motives, I finally hit a bottom. In that brief moment of desperation, my ego was temporarily defeated, and I surrendered enough to enter the program.

As I began working the Steps, and as my life got better, my ego rebounded. It was a constant struggle to rein it in. Thankfully with the help of my sponsor, the support of the fellowship, and by working the Twelve Steps, I was able to humble it enough to grow beyond its insatiable demands. I am grateful to how the Steps are structured, and especially to Steps Ten through Twelve, which allow me to keep my ego in check.

Now that I'm older and in a different stage of my life, the things that were so important to me – money, property and prestige – are more in the rear view mirror, and I am glad I've grown past them. Today, being comfortable in my own skin and grateful for what I have is much more satisfying than any of the things my ego thought I needed to be happy. I heard someone say that when you get older only two things really matter: having health and time. When I was younger those two things weren't even on my list. But now, with a little bit of wisdom and a lot of recovery, I see the truth in today's quote: age does take care of your ego.



CONCEPT 8:

The Trustees of the General Service Board act in two primary capacities: (a) With respect to the larger matters of over-all policy and finance, they are the principal planners and administrators. TRADITION 8 CHECKLIST:

Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

1. Is my own behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?

2. When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?

3. Do I sometimes try to get *some* reward—even if not money—for my personal AA efforts?

4. Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on *humility*?

5. Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?

6. In my own AA life, have I any experiences which illustrate the wisdom of this Tradition?

7. Have I paid enough attention to the book *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*? To the pamphlet *AA Tradition—How It Developed*?

When the Wave Comes Crashing

When the wave comes crashing it thrusts you down to the bottom of the ocean and you are breathing water and not air and if you are not breathing air the outcome is pretty certain.

The wave is a metaphor for all of those pieces of life we are trying to manage through our own self-will and not by connecting with our Higher Power as well as the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. The men and women of A.A., that are there to freely give themselves and share "nuggets of gold", will bring oxygen and life back into you. It is nothing short of amazing! Even better, it is freely available for anyone that is willing to take the first step through the door (out of the ocean) and open yourself to asking for help or just listening and hearing how others have overcome this illness and started breathing air that brings life back to the soul.

Asking for help isn't easy. However, if you do not ask the answer is pretty certain...Don't ask and the answer is, "No"...Ask and it is often, "Yes" or, "Sure." I've only been sober for less than 60 days, but over that period of time I have been to many meetings in many parts of

...I had two choices: Keep drinking and die or stop drinking and ask for help so I could live. Colorado, California and even in Mexico. I have been completely awestruck by the community and fellowship of AA that has, without judgment or pressure to be their version of a person (religious or otherwise), just given. They have given in an unconditional and compassionate manner that makes living possible again. Actually, living in a fantastic way, free from the demons that were drowning me!

My story is very similar to many that I have met in Alcoholics Anonymous. The insanity had gotten so heavy and the drowning of my being with alcohol brought me to a place where I had two choices: Keep drinking and die or stop drinking and ask for help so that I could live.

I am so grateful for many people that helped me to step through the door to my first meeting. Many were people that I had just met through my journey who had locations in Colorado and California. My first meeting was a "trip." It was in California and after the meeting, a guy who had only heard me and seen me for a few minutes, came up and gave me his phone number. He told me to give him a call if I needed any help. I explained that I was traveling back to Colorado the next day and he told me he would be giving me a call just to check in and see how I was doing...and he did!

Since that first meeting, I have been extraordinarily fortunate to have some extremely cool experiences. One experience came from my business trip to Mexico. Because I am very early in my sobriety, I made it a point to get to a meeting that first day when I arrived. The group was extremely cool and welcoming. I shared that I was visiting on business and asked for any suggestions on how to navigate the situation. Further, I asked if there was a phone list in the event of a rough situation where I needed help. They didn't have a phone list so I passed around a piece of paper and asked that anyone that felt comfortable in doing so, provide their name and phone number. All ten of the people in that room, including one other guy visiting, provided their numbers and a few came up to me afterward and told me to give them a call if I needed to get picked up due to a situation that threatened my sobriety. I am so glad to have the opportunity to share that experience as true evidence of the fellowship that <u>is</u> A.A. Trust me, my Higher Power was right there with me, helping me to continue ONWARD!

Want to get involved but just don't know what to do? Then jump right in and start answering the phone!


