Shift Happens

I was two years sober from alcohol at a yoga retreat in 2011 when I stumbled upon a bumper sticker, "Shift Happens." I was steeped in self-doubt and shame, and at this point in my recovery, I was still using the Steps as a way to punish myself. I was stealing, lying, and cheating. Deep down, I hated myself, and this unmedicated truth was destroying me and my relationships. I wanted someone to give me the formula, to tell me the exact actions I need to take the "fix" myself.

Someone once said to me: "The only thing wrong with you is that you don't know that you're a child of God." I believe that happiness is our birthright. One of the greatest barriers to living in this reality is our initial pain of separation from Source. Once we forgive this separation, we realize that the mistakes we make, the "character defects" revealed in steps four and five, are simply natural manifestations of this separation.

When I remembered who I was, perfectly imperfect in

the eyes of God, my old behaviors started to naturally fall away. I simply needed to ready myself for the shift. Getting ready was just the beginning. At this retreat, for the first time, I felt connected to a loving source inside myself like never before. I was overwhelmed with love and, for the first time, this love was directed at myself.

The Seventh Step prayer offers insight into the surrender required in Steps Six and Seven. "My Creator, I am now willing that you should have all of me, good and bad. I pray that you now remove from me every single defect of character which stands in the way of my usefulness to you and my fellows. Grant me strength as I go out from here to do your bidding. Amen."

Step Seven asks us to embrace our godliness and let Source take care of the rest. It would take many more years for some of my old behaviors to fall away and some still and will always remain, but I have stopped judging myself for these mistakes and instead correct them promptly while holding myself in God's grace.



But the Conference also recognizes that the chief initiative and the active responsibility in most of these matters should be exercised primarily by the Trustee members of the Conference when they act among themselves as the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous."



TRADITION 7 CHECKLIST

- Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new person who can't afford it? How generous was I when drunk in a barroom?
- How do I (or my group) support our International Journals of Alcoholics Anonymous, Grapevine and La Vina?
- 3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be OK to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- 4. Is it more important for a group to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- 5. Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- 6. Does my group have a "prudent reserve"? If yes, do I know what that amount is?
- 7. If a family member, work colleague or close friend who is not an AA member wants to make a financial contribution to my group, should the group accept it? What if my group is short on funds?
